24	Pursuant to Civil Local Rules 6-2 and 7-12 of the Northern District of California, Federal
25	Defendants United States Postal Service, Patrick R. Donahoe, Tom A. Samra, and Diana Alvarado
26	("Federal Defendants") <sup>1</sup> and Plaintiffs City of Berkeley and Mayor and Members of the City Council of

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the City of Berkeley ("Plaintiffs") by and through their respective counsel, hereby stipulate that, with
this Court's approval, the Federal Defendants shall have until and including November 25, 2014 to
respond to Plaintiffs' motion for a preliminary injunction, Plaintiffs shall have until and including
December 4, 2014 to reply, and the hearing on Plaintiffs' motion shall be continued to Thursday,
December 11, 2014 at 8 a.m. or any date and time this Court chooses.

1. On November 5, 2014, Plaintiffs filed a Complaint for Declaratory and Injunctive Relief
(ECF 1) and a motion for a temporary restraining order and preliminary injunction (ECF 3), to enjoin
named Federal Defendants from completing a sale of the Berkeley Post Office, located at 2000 Allston
Way, Berkeley, California. In its motion, Plaintiffs stated "the City believes that USPS will attempt to
convey the Post Office property at any moment . . . ." (ECF 3, Pls.' Mem. 1.)

On November 5, 2014, this Court granted Plaintiffs' request for a Temporary Restraining
 Order, enjoining Defendants from completing the sale of the Berkeley Post Office until a hearing on the
 motion for preliminary injunction can be conducted. (ECF 8.) The Court's Order set the deadline for
 Defendants' opposition to the preliminary injunction motion as 12:00 PM on November 7, 2014 and set
 a hearing for November 10, 2014 at 8:00 am. In its Order, the Court cited to Plaintiffs' statement that
 the City believed the conveyance would occur "at any moment."

3. Although the USPS has entered into an Agreement for the Purchase and Sale of the
Berkeley Post Office, a closing of the sale under that Agreement is neither certain nor imminent. (See
Declaration of Joseph D. Lowe). For example, the purchaser is still conducting its due diligence review
and has the right to terminate the agreement for any reason on or before December 5, 2014. (Lowe
Decl. ¶ 4.) Moreover, under the Agreement, the closing deadline is not until December 22, 2014, and
Defendants have attested that, in support of this request for an extension, they will not seek to close the
sale until at least December 17, 2014. (Lowe Decl. ¶ 5.)

4. Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(b)(2), unless this Court orders otherwise,
this Court's current temporary restraining order is in effect until at least November 19, 2014, or any date
to which this Court, for good cause, extends it or to which Federal Defendants consent;

5. Should this Court approve this Stipulation, per Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(b)(2),
Defendants consent to an extension of the temporary restraining order until December 17, 2014.

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1	6. Any delay caused by this extension would prejudice Federal Defendants, not Plaintiffs;
2	and
3	7. No prior extensions of time have been requested or granted.
4	8. THEREFORE, because the closing of the potential sale is not imminent and to ensure
5	that the United States can provide this Court with a complete and thoughtful response to the Plaintiffs'
6	motion, the parties, through their counsel, hereby stipulate, subject to the Court's approval, that Federal
7	Defendants shall have until and including November 25, 2014 to respond to Plaintiffs' motion for a
8	preliminary injunction, Plaintiffs shall have until and including December 4, 2014 to reply, and the
9	hearing on Plaintiffs' motion shall be continued to Thursday, December 11, 2014 at 8 a.m. or any date
10	and time this Court chooses.
